Joint Partnership Arrangements

Blessing-Rieman College of Nursing and Health Sciences (BRCN) is partnered with Culver-Stockton College (CSC) and Quincy University (QU) to offer joint Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care, and a Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Sciences degree programs. These programs are referred to as the basic track BSN, RC, and RT program options. Culver-Stockton College is located in Canton, Missouri, and Quincy University is located in Quincy, Illinois. The joint program is on-campus and students will be attending classes at both institutions.

First-time or transfer students apply first to CSC or QU to start the application process. Once the students are accepted to one of the partner schools, BRCN grants them an acceptance based certain admissions criteria. Students take freshman pre-requisite courses and all general education courses throughout the program at the partner school. All nursing, respiratory, or radiology courses are taken at BRCN. First-time students are eligible to enroll in major specific courses after completing their freshman pre-requisite courses and maintaining the required grade point averages. Transfer students are eligible to enroll in nursing courses if they have completed the required nursing pre-requisite courses as well as the admissions requirements specific to transfer students. The freshman and sophomore years of the program, students pay CSC or QU tuition. All awarding of financial aid during these two years is completed through CSC or QU. The junior and senior year, the student will pay BRCN tuition. All awarding of financial aid will be completed through Blessing-Rieman. When awarding aid, both institutions request completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and will award instructional scholarships as appropriate.
